

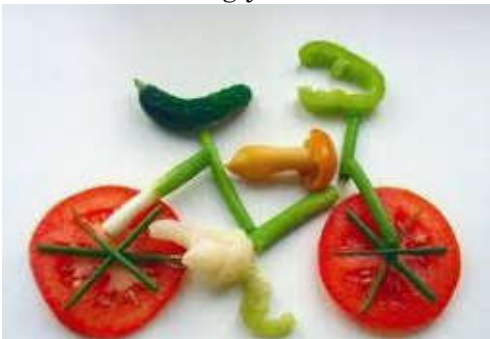
PALACE WOOD PRIMARY SCHOOL
