In EYFS this week, we have continued to celebrate autumn! We enjoyed exploring the pumpkins in the home corner and created careful observational drawings of them in the creative area. We used tongs to rescue our autumn materials from the tuff tray and had lots of fun practising our climbing, balancing and jumping skills on the obstacle course outside.







Year One - Bears and Giraffes

This week Year one have been learning about adding in different ways, using the part / whole model and 10 frames. In English we have continued with the Owl Babies story. In art we are looking at the different shades of a colour and mixing paints to make a colour darker. We have had a busy week, but had lots of fun.











In year 2 we have been learning about living things and their habitats.

This week we made a bug hotel together. Perhaps you will be able to spot it around school..







This week Year 3 have been learning about the different layers of soil in Science. They worked in pairs to recreate the layers using materials they found outside such as rocks, soil and grass/leaves. They came back into the classroom to label these together.







In year 4 this week we have really enjoyed being able to go back to the library. We have enjoyed choosing different books, being able to sit and read and share books together. It was so lovely to be back! In Science we also explored how we could see the effects of volume of sound on the vibrations produced.

















This week Year 5 held a debate about screen use. We also had question time with some special guests, Mrs Vincent and Mrs Cairns. We were very interested to find out what they thought about using iPads, mobile phones, consoles and other screens! We got some great information that will really help us to write our balanced arguments on the subjects.













Year 6 have been debating this week during their R.E. lessons. What is more important Art and Architecture or Charity and Generosity. They had healthy debates across both classes and will be using these to inform their written answers next week. They have begun to write their own story in English based on The Fireworkmaker's Daughter by Phillip Pullman and have so far created some lengthy and detailed stories.
