

Year 2 have had an exciting time this week. On Thursday we had a whole school Music Inspire Day.

We thought about how the music could tell a story. Then we made lots of different things to match the music. We put it all together at the end of the day and made well, why don't you ask us!







This week in year three we have been writing our own versions of 'Star in a Jar'. We have also been continuing with our work on the column method and moving onto subtraction. In Science we summarised all that we have learnt throughout the term and created posters on our knowledge; including the types of rock and where fossils come from. In History we discussed the Iron Age and learnt about hillforts and why these were useful. Yesterday we had a fantastic day inspired by music. As a class we came up with an idea and we are very pleased with our creations. Here are two sneak peaks of what we created in our classes.






