Headteachers Message

Dear Parents and Carers,

Another week has flown by, helped by the beautiful autumn weather. It's lovely to see children still eating outside at lunchtimes and enjoying the freedom of the field.

Our EYFS children have completed their first full week at school and, although a few seemed tired today, we are very proud of how well they have settled. Pupils from Maplesden Noakes school came in this morning and our year 6 children enjoyed being part of an assembly delivered by the year 7s. All the children have been learning harvest songs this week and it is lovely to hear singing in school again.

The staggered times at the beginning and end of the day seem to be working well but could I ask that, at the end of the day, you do your best to pick your child up as close to their finish time as you can. Teachers will wait for 5 minutes after the end of the day and after this, children will be taken to Oak's office for collection. Teachers often have meetings to attend straight after school and, at times, it can be challenging to get there promptly if they have needed to stay with children. If you are going to be late collecting' we will of course keep your children safe and cared for but at the central point of the main office.

We looked at our cards which showed us how many of each object we needed to find. With our partners, we counted carefully to make sure we had the right amount!




YEAR 1


YEAR 2

YEAR 3




This week in year 3 we have been finishing our unit on place value with a focus on comparing objects and numbers, ordering numbers and counting in 50s. We struggled a little with counting in 50s but when we noticed the pattern it really helped us!

In English we wrote our own versions of 'Stone Age Boy' and made it our own, we used lots of similes and alliteration!

In Science we learnt about Sedimentary rock and talked about how it is formed.

In History we discussed the different eras within the Stone age including; Palaeolithic, Mesolithic and Neolithic. In RE we learnt about Islam and its five pillars.



YEAR 4



This week in Year 4 we have been studying Street Art, we have had the opportunity to learn about the artist Banksy and produce our own marvellous Street Art! In Science we have investigated high and low pitch and used a range of diverse instruments and equipment to test our hypothesis to see whether smaller objects produced a higher pitch.



YEAR 5



Year 5 have started learning street dance with some amazing techniques from incredible dancers such as Diversity.

We can see that dance can be for anyone not just girls and this will be an amazing chance to try something challenging and new this term.

We have already found out that even a warm up can be tiring and hard work! Maybe by the end of the term it will be good enough to perform!
