Look out next week for all the things we have planned for them!







We made baby owls using dry leaves from the playground and have sequenced the story into mini story books. The children enjoyed learning facts about real Owls today. This week in Year 2 we have been painting abstract shape pictures in the style of Mondrian using just primary colours.


