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

This week in EYFS, we have continued to learn about Bog Baby for World Book Day. We have used the book to explore compassion and the importance of showing this to our friends at school. The children have been recognising this in their friends and letting an adult at school know when someone has been kind to them. YEAR1

A big thank you to all of you who are bringing your waste in to be recycled. A reminder that the recycling should only be brought in on a Wednesday as we cannot store it.

This week was a huge pringles cans collection week with 40 cans sent in. This is the most amount of cans we have received in one month, let alone in one week. In February we collected over 3kg of waste again, but we are set to collect even more in March as in this first week alone, we have already reached 2.9kg.

We are just short of 10kg collected so far since the start of Waste Wednesday. It is great to see that we are diverting all this waste from incinerators and landfill but also raising funding for the school.

See the pictures below for acceptable waste. Please remind yourselves as we are getting items that cannot be sent away. Remember Pringles cans only no other brands. Don't forget the bread wrappers.
