


We have had an extremely exciting week I EYFS. We extended our topic of 'Habitats', to look at 'Dinosaurs'. We had a fantastic visit from Maidstone Museum, where we made fossil rubbings, drew huge dinosaur fossils and learnt how a fossil is formed.

Our parent consultations meant we could share with you, all the fantastic learning the children have been doing since they joined us. It was lovely to finally be able to see so many of you in person.





YEAR 1



This week in Year 1 we have been comparing height and lengths of objects using the terms taller than and shorter than. We have also been measuring with non standard units such as cubes. Next week we will be beginning to use rulers to measure with so if you can practice using one over the weekend with your grown up that would be great!





YEAR 2

This week during science year 2 have been continuing with our plant topic by examining and labelling the parts of flowering plants and trees in our local environment. We have also been keeping a bean diary as a record of how much our broad beans that we planted in different conditions are growing.



YEAR 3




This week, in year 3, we have been beginning a new text, 'My Strong Mind'. In maths, we have began looking at statistics. In science, we have been trying out different experiments to observe how water moves through plants. In DT we have even started trying a back stitch!






YEAR 4

This week Year 4 have enjoyed exploring our new novel study text 'The Miraculous Journey of Edward Tulane.' We have been working on our reading aloud and thinking about using clues in the text to decide what is happening. We have loved learning new words and phrases. Our particular favourite was 'full of ennui'.'



YEAR 5



This week Year 5 have been producing some writing based on the story Cosmic. The children have focused on complex sentences and the characters inner thoughts. Year 5 are becoming more confident at deepening the moment (adding detail) to their writing.





YEAR 6

This week, Year 6 have been working on volume in maths, including solving some very tricky problems. We have also started gathering information about WW1 and, where appropriate, linking it to current events. Curiosity, compassion and challenge have abounded in these lessons, and we have been amazed by the courage others have shown in very difficult situations. In Art, we have been creating our own pieces in the style of different artists, including Wassily Kandisky and Frido Kahlo.
